

The Pampered Pooch & Pals Doggie Daycare "The Rules"

(We want daycare to be a safe, healthy and fun place for dogs to play! The staff reserves the right to refuse any dogs which may not be appropriate for daycare.)

Rules for Dog Owners!

- Hours of Operation-7:30AM-6:00PM
- All dogs must be observed for temperament prior to being admitted to daycare.
- Owners must complete the daycare application and sign releases before dog(s) can be admitted to daycare.
- Proof of vaccination is required.
- Dogs must be dropped off and picked up within the hours stated above.
- We understand pick up emergencies will occur, however we do not encourage late pick up. We request that owners contact us ASAP at 363-0396 should an emergency arise. We reserve the right to assess a \$15.00 charge for every 15 minutes after 6PM. Repeated late pick up may result in removal from the daycare program.
- Dogs must be on a leash at all times during drop off and pick up.
- For liability reasons, we cannot allow owners in the daycare area during normal daycare hours. Owners are free to visit their dog at any time during the day, however we will bring the dog into the store area.

Rules for Dogs!

- All dogs must be a minimum of 16 weeks old prior to admission to daycare.
- Puppies must have had at least one initial physical by their Veterinarian and their first set of vaccinations prior to admission.
- All dogs must be current in all vaccines or have positive vaccine titers, and all documentation must be presented prior to daycare evaluation.
- All dogs must be spayed or neutered by 10 months or will not be allowed to continue in daycare. (The Pampered Pooch and Pals will not assume responsibility for unplanned pregnancies!)
- In an effort to insure the safety of all parties- all dogs will have a daycare evaluation consisting of ½ day evaluation and if found appropriate for daycare, a subsequent 2 week probation period will ensue.
- During the evaluation and probation periods the following will be considered:
 - Temperament and social skills
 - Ability to play in a large group
 - Excessive barking
 - Any problem with separation anxiety
 - Food aggression.
